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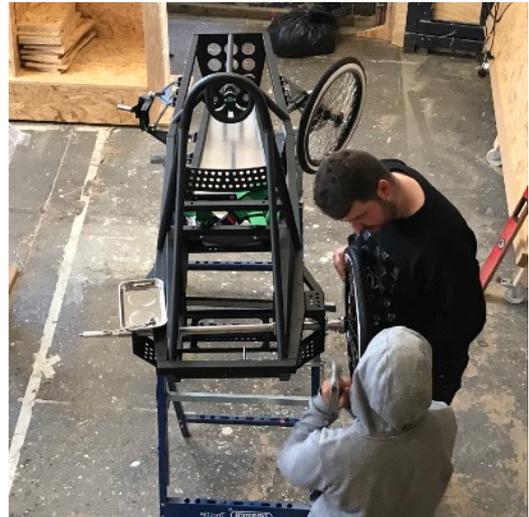


KIT CAR PROJECT 2020

Funded by Sussex Police, the TDC Kit Car Project aims to help young people develop practical and creative skills, grow together as a team and be competitive.

The electric, single-seater cars can reach a top speed of 20-35mph depending on how they're built. Most of the competitors are from secondary schools who have been entering one or more cars for several years. That hasn't stopped the TDC team reaching a top-10 position in their class and picking up the 2019 Best Newcomer award.

Greenpower Formula-24 races are won by the car completing the most distance in 90mins. There are two races at each event with 3 drivers competing in each race. This season we expect to compete at two race days at the Goodwood motor racing circuit as well as an open test day.



The project is run by a team of 3 staff and a volunteer from Sussex Police. They are all DBS checked and have experience working with young people.

Starting March 5th 2020, workshop sessions will be taking place weekly in the Hall at One Church Brighton, Gloucester Place (BN1 4AA) on Thursday evenings from 5pm.

We will also be organising a go-karting evening that takes place on a Sunday evening in Lancing and there may be other additional trips as part of the learning experience of this project.

The whole project should last until June

2020 and will run during school holidays.

To be a part of the race team the young person will need to be aged 11-16 years old and live or go to school in the Brighton & Hove area.



IMPORTANT INFO

What do I need to wear?

Anything you don't mind getting marks on. Avoid light coloured clothes. For safety you need to have closed-toe shoes. For race days and track testing there's some more rules about what you need to wear.

I need help getting there...

How much does it cost?

It costs you nothing.

Is there an age limit?

To race the car you'll need to be aged 11-16 years. If you're a bit older you can still help with the team and attend race days.

What if I get hungry?

We don't provide meals but for every session we will provide drinks and snacks.

Is it safe?

All motorsport can be dangerous. We provide helmets and gloves for race days and testing - you won't be allowed to drive without them. The project manager will be checking over the cars to make sure they are built to a safe standard. The cars also get checked by a separate team on the race day to make sure they are safe to run.

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Consent

Motorsports can be dangerous and may result in injury. Every young person and an adult with Parental Responsibility for them must read and agree to the following declaration and terms & conditions in order to take part in the project and race day events:

Young person:

1. By taking part I accept the risks involved including the risk of injury. Before taking part in a race I will make sure, by checking out the track, that I am familiar with its features and layout. I will read, ensure I understand and will comply with all of the race track instructions, regulations and the instructions of TDC staff and volunteers during race events and project sessions. I understand that reckless and dangerous driving is strictly forbidden and will result in my immediate dismissal from race day events, testing events or workshop sessions.
2. I will not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs during race day events, kit car building sessions or other sessions I take part in during this project.
3. I will make sure that staff are aware if I'm feeling unwell or for any reason am unable to responsibly manage pre-existing health conditions and/or prescribed medications

Code of Conduct

We know that building kit cars can sometimes be frustrating and people can be annoying. We're not asking anyone to be perfect.

Be respectful of other's and don't make assumptions about what they're going through.

If we raise our voices it will be to alert you to something dangerous so please pay attention.

If things get difficult we will do what we can to make sure you can work things out and keep coming along.

You can only come to the go-karting evening if you've taken part in most of the workshop sessions.

On race days, the Team Principle will make final decisions about who competes in each race session and what order you go in. This will be done to balance everyone getting a chance and make the team as competitive as possible.

We will try to make sure everyone gets a race seat but priority will be given to the young people who make a positive contribution to the team and building the car.

Don't wear your best trainers and clothes unless you're willing to risk getting oil, paint and dirt on them.

Open-toe footwear is not allowed during any of the sessions including race days.

You must also wear long-sleeve tops, full length trousers, gloves and a helmet for race days and test sessions or you will not be allowed to compete. We won't run you home to fetch some other clothes.

If you have customised your own race helmet you're only allowed to take it home at the very end of the project. Otherwise we will look after it.

If the project leader thinks your behaviour is violent, likely to cause damage, distress or excessive annoyance to other young people and staff on the project you may be asked to sit out part or all of a session. In some cases you might be asked not to come back for a session. In extreme circumstances you will be asked to leave the project.

You are not allowed to use drugs or alcohol on any of the premises involved in this project. If at any point during sessions there is a concern that you may not be able to work safely due to intoxication and use of drugs (including cannabis) you will be asked to leave the session, but you can come back for the next one. Use of drugs & alcohol is strictly forbidden during motorsport events (kit car race days and go-karting) and you won't be able to take part in any racing.
