Part of my work has been supporting the Healthy Neighbourhood Fund (HNF), administered by Albion Life with applications evaluated by local community members. The HNF is aimed at supporting small community groups and projects with a focus on

improving health and wellbeing in the area. Well done to the following groups and projects in Tarner and Eastern Road:

New Ward Councillors

We're Tristram and Chandni, and are really excited to be introducing ourselves as your new Councillors for Queen's Park. We're intent on accomplishing a lot, and along with a 38-majority administration, we can.

For Tarner, and indeed a lot of the ward, our top priorities are: Getting the bins sorted - from recycling to regular waste collection, what we have isn't working .

We need to sort out our green spaces and community assets - whether it's cleaning up Tarner Tower or getting public toilets re-opened and refurbished in Queen's Park, too much of our beloved ward looks neglected. The Albion Community Garden is a great example of what's possible and we'll provide whatever support we can to keep this vital project running.

Related to that second priority is creating a more responsive council. Whether cleaning tags off almost everything, fixing streetlights or filling seemingly forever potholes, residents need a swifter response to issues. The processes in place haven't worked for residents. This will change, and residents will notice the difference that your Labour councillors and a 38-seat majority can make.

We're open to sharing ideas and are always listening. We're running regular Councillor Open Doors across the ward every month:

1st Friday, 12:30-13:30 at Craven Vale Community Association in Hadlow Close

2nd Saturday, 11:00-12:00, at the Albion Hub, Thornsdale

3rd Saturday, 11:30-12:30, St. Luke's Church on Queen's Park Rd.







<u>The Hanover Homeless Project</u> provides essential household goods for people who are moving into a home after experiencing homelessness.

We are so delighted to be welcomed to the Albion Hub where volunteers buy, receive, pack and deliver "starter packs". These include enough basics for people with enough to help them manage through their first 24 hours.



Typically, a pack includes: Pots and pans, crockery and cutlery, bedding and towels, tea, coffee, biscuits, noodles and soup, toiletries and a notebook and pen

The HHP has been running for five years. We receive requests from a number of charities, and council departments.

Volunteers are always welcome for making up packs, shopping, delivery and fundraising.

Free University Brighton at Thornsdale

The Free University Brighton (FUB) moved into the Albion Hub in the Thornsdale tower block last August. We've been running free evening classes this year, covering philosophy, history, critical thinking, theology and politics. We provide online classes as well as face to face classes in community spaces. Our slogan is 'education for love, not money'.

We have some exciting plans for next year. We are organising a year long introduction to the humanities that will run at the Albion Hub in the Thornsdale block. We've got tutors from the University Brighton directly of involved. Successful completion of this year long program of study would enable you to get a place on a humanities course at that University. If you've ever thought about getting a degree but were unsure about what was involved, here is an opportunity to find out for free. Think of this as a free foundation course.

FUB provides university level education but we cannot provide you with a piece of paper with the word 'degree' on it. Not everyone wants or needs a degree and we provide classes for all, for free, on a range of subjects in the humanities and social sciences. So whether you're thinking of pursuing a formal degree education, or whether you just want to learn for the love of it and out of your own curiosity, FUB is the place to be.

Jollof Cafe

We are the Sussex Refugee and Migrant Self Support Group. We run the Jollof Cafe every Wednesday at West Hill Hall on Compton Avenue.

The Cafe provides a free-price lunch with a suggested donation of £5. The atmosphere is welcoming and joyous. Any money that we make goes into our destitution funds. We use those to help people out with little payments, like a taxi from a hospital appointment or a new winter coat. We also organise days out for our members. We spread the love where we go.

People can come to the Cafe for advice and support. There are case workers from local refugee housing charity, Thousand 4 £1000 (T4K) and Refugee Radio. We are all experts by experience and happy to support new members as they do battle with the Hostile Environment.
